Leaving School Grounds Student Sign-In, Sign-out Policy

Students are not permitted to leave school property without written permission from parents or guardians. This includes appointments and lunch. Students are to sign-out and sign-in once they return to the school. Parents/guardians are responsible for the conduct, safety and well being of students when they are given permission to leave school property.

Lunch Routines

Please complete the form indicating if your child(ren) will be staying at school for lunch. Students should either return home or remain at school on a regular basis. Students who regularly stay at school for lunch will be required to bring a signed note each time they leave school grounds. Students who do not bring a note indicating a change will be required to follow their regular routine. Please impress the importance of returning directly back to the school on time.

Forgotten Lunch

Please leave your child's forgotten lunch with your child's name on it, on the table outside of the office. Students will be permitted to come to pick up their lunch when the bell rings. Tags and pens are conveniently available for you to label your child's lunch. Please remember, that with the buzzer entry system, it may be easier to send lunch to school in the morning.

Extra-curricular Activities & Excursions

Students will have the opportunity to take field trips and participate in a number of extra-curricular activities. Permission forms will be sent home to be filled out, signed and promptly returned to school.

NO STUDENT WILL BE ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE ON A TRIP OR EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITY WITHOUT WRITTEN CONSENT FROM THEIR PARENT / GUARDIAN. VERBAL CONSENT OVER THE TELEPHONE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. No exceptions will be allowed. Teachers give ample notice for trip consent forms.

We encourage parents to support these educational opportunities by volunteering to assist and supervise these excursions. Remember, only parents with current Criminal Reference Checks will be permitted to supervise field trips. Parent volunteers are usually necessary on most trips. If possible, please try to volunteer as a trip supervisor.

Freedom of Information & Protection Act

From time to time, throughout the school year, photographs of students participating in school based activities e.g. Sacramental Celebrations, graduation, written work, special award recognition, school teams, classroom activities, may be taken to be used in school and/or board publications. In case of accident, personal information such as: name, age, grade, address may be given to hospital, ambulance, police, firefighters in attendance. Should you prefer your child's photograph not to be used, or information not to be given, please indicate as such on the Media Consent portion of the Verification form.

Visitors

All visitors, parents and volunteers coming into the school are expected to **report to the office upon arrival to sign-in.** For the safety of your child and others, staff have been instructed to request all persons not wearing a visitor's pass to return to the office to obtain one. Please remember that we are responsible for the safety of all our students and this is an expectation for all parents, visitors and volunteers at all Dufferin Peel schools.

Safety

Kiss and Ride

To ensure the safety of all students, parents are reminded that parking in the Kiss & Ride is illegal.

Parents are asked to park their vehicles on the street or parking lot and walk to drop off and pick up their child(ren) from the appropriate entry/exit door.

The following information is provided to ensure the safety of all students who will need to cross the driveway:

- adhere to the directional arrows marking one way only traffic
- drive carefully and slowlyWATCH FOR STUDENTS
- Drop students off in the Kiss
 N'Ride lane at the side of the school.

Early Arrival

Students must remain outside of the school building until 8:30am. Teachers will be available to supervise students at 8:15am, and entry to the school will begin at the 8:30am bell.

Bicycle / Scooter Safety

- 1. Walk bicycles on school property.
- 2. Lock bicycles in the bicycle racks
- 3. Obey all bicycle safety rules.
- 4. Roller blades and skateboards are not to be used on school property.



Walkers

Please continue to instruct your child regarding safe passage to school; i.e. crossing streets at signed locations, walking with a buddy, and to always watch out for vehicles. Use sidewalks and avoid crossing or walking along the centre of the parking lot.

Health

Medication

On occasion, the school is asked to store and/or administer medication to students. A completed form must accompany each request for medication to be stored and given out by the school personnel. Ask the Office to supply you with the appropriate forms. Anaphylaxis forms/ Asthma forms will be sent home in Student Packages. Please complete and return forms as soon as possible. This is necessary to update files annually and inform staff of student medical concerns.

ALLERGY AWARENESS

We have a number of children in our school who have severe life threatening allergic reactions to peanuts, peanut butter, peanut oils and any nut by -products.

Other life threatening allergens may include allergies to eggs, dairy, and flour products, sesame seeds and types of seafood if ingested by the student.



Please note that due to life-threatening allergies, parents are not permitted to send food to the school to be distributed to classmates i.e. birthday cake, cupcakes, Halloween candy, etc.

All edible products sent to school for distribution will be returned home with the student at the end of the day.



No Child Without.

Our school is involved in the Canadian MedicAlert Foundation's *No Child Without* program. There is no cost for students who attend our school and are between the ages of 4 up to their 14th birthday to join MedicAlert through this program. If your child has a medical condition, allergy or is required to take medication on a regular basis, then you should consider this program. A child's MedicAlert identification can alert school staff, friends, coaches and others about your child's medical condition should an emergency occur.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL FRONT DOORS LOCKED

You may be aware that a few years ago, through the province's Safe School Welcome Program, St. Philip Catholic School received a grant that provides for the installation of a front door speaker/buzzer/video monitoring system. The installation of this system allows us to proactively enhance the safety and security of students and staff by locking the front doors after classes begin. This change in access to our school requires a new access protocol that will apply to all visitors, including parents and guardians. The system has been installed and activated.

Under this system, visitors may gain entrance by pressing a buzzer mounted on the wall outside the building, beside the front door. The buzzer activates a two-way speaker and camera system. The Office will then be able to determine who is at the door, by observing on a video monitor. This will enable better regulation of visitor access to the school.

The following are also part of our school safety protocol:

All outside doors are locked and entry can be gained only through the front door.

All visitors, including parents/guardians must sign in at the office and wear a Visitor's badge.

Access during lunch time may be delayed depending on the availability of staff who are required to monitor the new system. No students will be permitted to monitor the system.

The co-operation and understanding of parents/guardians will be an important factor in the success of our new protocol. In this regard, parents/guardians are encouraged to:

- 1. Arrive at school on time to allow children to enter with their classmates to avoid front entry lates and ringing of bell during prayers, O Canada and morning announcements (announcements will take place at 8:35am)
- Send lunch with your child in the morning to limit traffic in through the front door at lunch time.
- 3. We respectfully request that you limit your visits to the school during the daytime in order to protect the instructional time and reduce interruptions.

Thank you for your understanding and co-operation as we continue to implement the access protocol. As always, if you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact the office.

The history of Catholic schools in Ontario since 1841 is one of dedication and perseverance in the face of financial hardship and adversity. Due to the commitment of the religious teaching orders, the bishops and priests, the teachers, parents, and students, our forebears have handed to us a great gift – a fully funded public Catholic school system.

The courts of Ontario and Canada have reinforced the rights of the Catholic school system with a number of judgments which affirmed the rights of separate school boards to:

- (a) have their guaranteed powers in the Separate School Act of 1863 improved,
- (b) receive equitable funding,
- (c) prefer Catholics when hiring elementary and secondary school teachers.
- (d) have their own buildings,
- (e) have an exclusive Catholic school community.

The integration of religious truths and values with life is one of the most significant elements that distinguish Catholic schools from other schools. This is a matter of crucial importance today in view of contemporary trends and pressures to compartmentalize life and learning and to isolate the religious dimension of existence from other areas of human life. The courts have recognized, over the years, that Catholic education is not a subject but rather a way to view the world that speaks to the interrelationship between faith, knowledge and action. The Catholic school is a unique setting within which this ideal can be realized in the lives of Catholic children and young people. In our Catholic schools this reality can and is lived out.

PLEASE DO NOT STAND IN THE SCHOOL PLAY YARD BEFORE SCHOOL


We kindly ask that parents remain off the pavement when dropping off their children in the morning.

Ideas for How You Can Help Your Child Get off to a Successful Start

some ideas that will help you get your child off to a great start:
\square Get a head start by organizing the night before. You can review and sign the agenda, review forms,
pack lunches, decide clothing to wear and place backpacks at the front door.
\square Establish consistent sleep routines so that your child is rested for school in the morning.
\square Develop a morning routine. When things are done in the same order each morning, they become
automatic. For example: make bed, get dressed, brush teeth, and put on shoes.
☐ Choose a consistent homework time and place. Choose a time when your child will have energy and motivation to do school work. Creating a quiet spot with the necessary materials that are used at the same time each evening for homework helps develop good habits.
\square Encourage and support the use of the student agenda each day. Taking time to review it, discuss it
and sign it each night will keep you informed and assist your child in developing a lifelong organization- al skill.
\square Set priorities. Scheduling things like homework, family meals and free time on a calendar help organ-
ize time. Treat these times like appointments that must be kent
